The Great Thanksgiving

(Book of Common Prayer, Eucharistic Prayer A, pp.361)

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People And also with you. (arms stretched out)

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People We lift them to the Lord. (arms lifted above your head)

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give God thanks and praise. (hands clasped in front of your chest)

Celebrant It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to

you, God Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

Fr. Jerry asks the kids things they are thankful for and tells the story of God's Creation.

Celebrant And so with thanks and praise we sing, repeating after me.

sung as a call and response

Fr. Jerry tells the story of Christ's <u>Last Supper</u> with the Disciples and then we will say:

Celebrant Let us proclaim the three things we believe about Christ (aka "mystery of faith"):

All Christ has died. (arms in cross position)

Christ is risen. (arms up)

Christ will come again. (arms make circle back to up position)

Fr. Jerry continues and asks the <u>Holy Spirit</u> to be present in the bread, the wine and in us. At conclusion everyone joins in singing the "**Great Amen**" following Fr. Jerry.

After the "Great Amen," Fr. Jerry sends the <u>kids back to their families</u> and some may choose to hold hands and pray the prayer that Jesus taught his disciples.

Celebrant As we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior Jesus Christ, we are bold

to say:

All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name,

thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those, who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
